WHO WAS STLAWRENCE?

St Lawrence (Laurence) was born in Spain, (Zaragoza) in AD 225, and made his way to Rome in AD 257 with a future Pope, Sixtus.

Lawrence, was appointed as a deacon, was put in a position of great trust, with care of the treasury and riches of the church. Bit like Joe!!

He was also responsible for the distribution of alms to the poor, in a time of extreme poverty, when only the rich could afford food.

After the execution of Pope Sixtus and many of the deacons, by beheading, Rome demanded Lawrence turn over the riches of the church. He asked for three days so he could gather together all the riches and asked them to bring many wagons to take his bounty away.

Lawrence gathered the indigent, crippled, blind and suffering, declaring these are the real treasures of the Church, stating, "You see, we are truly rich, far richer than your Emperor." I think he'd given the treasures to the poor to purchase food.

The Roman prefect was so incensed, so angry, he considered beheading too quick a death, he had a great GRIDIRON prepared with hot coals beneath, and had Lawrence martyred on it, hence the many references to the GRIDIRON, in and around our church furniture, plaques, plates etc.

He is the patron saint for cooks, bakers, brewers and tanners, those working with fire. Oh, and also comedians. It is alleged he said, 'I've already been done on one side.'

How many symbol's of the GRIDIRON can you find in and around our building? Some are on display; some are sadly pushed out of the way.
